Executive Director's Note

Rape: A Men's Issue

While on the Internet I was pleasantly surprised to see a growing number of men's groups dedicated to stopping rape. For years, rape and sexual assault had been considered a women's issue and a women's problem.

Something has always felt unfair and unbalanced in this approach. Rape is also a men's issue, and here are the many reasons why.

Men rape and are raped. Males perpetrate the vast majority of the sexual assaults against women. Even when men are sexually victimized, other men are most often the perpetrator. Male victims of sexual assault, like female victims, are often not believed, blamed and stigmatized by society. Only in recent years have men begun to step forward and seek assistance for their trauma.

Men know survivors. With one of four women and one of six men being a survivor of sexual violence, men's lives are also impacted. It could be anyone in his life: wife or husband, girlfriend or boyfriend, sister or brother, niece or nephew, grandmother or grandfather, or daughter or son who may disclose and men must be prepared to respond non-judgmentally and with understanding and compassion. A supportive male can positively impact the survivors healing process.

Rape is a choice. Some men make the choice to use sex as a weapon for power and control. For sexual violence to end men must be empowered to make different choices. All men can be a part of this process by challenging rape myths, speaking out against violence toward women and raising awareness about the impact of sexual violence. Men can step up and challenge other men who exhibit behaviors and talk that perpetuates sexual violence. Adult modeling of behavior has a significant impact on children's attitudes and behaviors. Men who model attitudes and behaviors that show respect for women go a long way in educating young men that masculinity is not about power and control.

ERINS LAW

Erin's Law, or Illinois Public Act 097-1147, requires public schools to provide child sexual abuse prevention education for children in pre-kindergarten through twelfth grades.

Age appropriate instruction helps students learn to recognize unsafe situations, ways to increase their safety and how to respond.

Presentations include:

- Safe vs. unsafe touch and unwanted touching
- The difference between good and bad secrets
- 3. How to tell a trusted adult if any situation makes them uncomfortable.

Volunteer!

Rockford Sexual Assault Counseling, Inc. recruits volunteers to provide advocacy for victims of sexual assault or abuse and their families. Volunteers play an important role in helping victims feel they are not alone and not to blame for the assault or abuse.

Our agency provides a 40 hour training session for all volunteers. The topics discussed will include, but are not limited to: basic advocacy techniques, the Illinois Criminal Sexual Assault Law, medical care of the victim, crisis intervention, child sexual abuse, and community resources. Volunteers providing advocacy play a crucial role in providing crisis intervention services to victims of assault or abuse.

Requirements for becoming an RSAC volunteer:

- At least 18 years old
- Background check
- Available for on call two weekday evenings a month or one weekend day a month
- Have reliable transportation with insurance
- Have a phone

Fee for training class is \$40 to cover materials.
